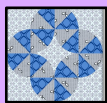

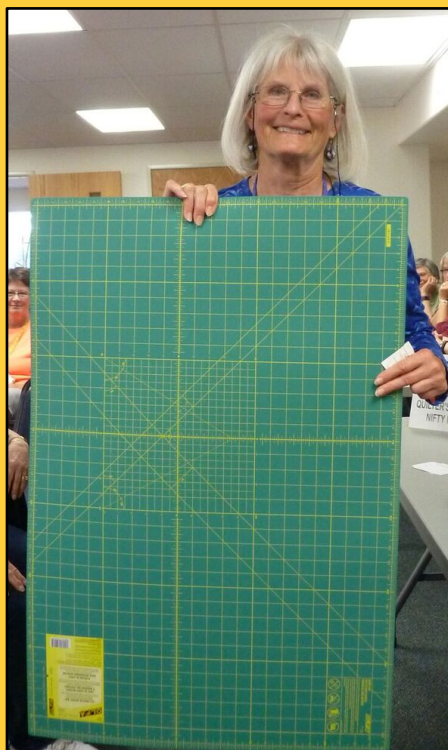

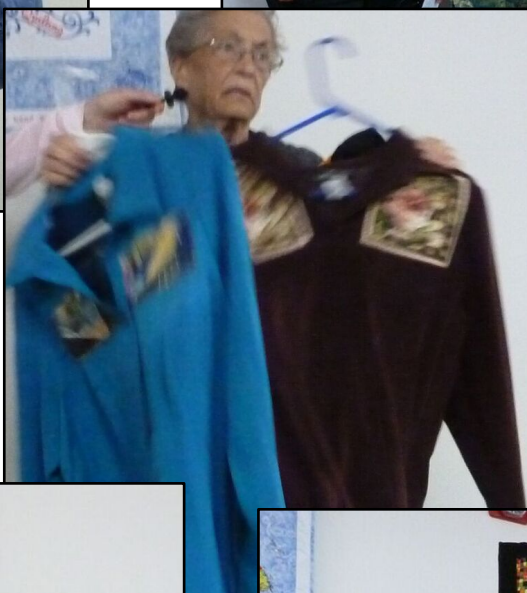

MINUTES OF THE JULY 13, 2017 OCQC GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The meeting was called to order by President Phoebe Hein at 6 pm. The minutes of the general meeting on June 8, 2017 were approved as published after a motion made by Cindy McEntee that passed.

Announcement Memorial Service for Polly Ostling, July 22nd at 11 am, Church of the Nazarene.

Library Small Quilts Voting will take place end of month with \$50 donation to winner's charity of choice.

Quilt Show Auction Half of the proceeds will be donated to charity of choice.

2017 Quilt Show Vendor sales tags for Boutique are available for pick up today. Still need volunteers to help days of the show; sign-up with Jean Amundson. Set up and take down – Angell Job Corp will help, Jane Szabo needs additional 7 and 8 ft ladders. Jennifer Reinhart reported 4-H Ribbons and Sponsored Ribbons are finished. Sponsors need to pick up at 1 pm on set up day and fill out award. Janet Scanlon and Dolores Thomas will have Sponsored Ribbons at show. Special ribbons will be on Sponsored Ribbons table for pick up. There are 43 Sponsored Ribbons! Jane Szabo was winner of drawing for Sponsored Ribbons and received a goodie bag. Nan Scott reported Quilt Intake Day is 1:45 – 5:30 pm on Monday, July 31st. All quilts to be delivered to Atonement Lutheran Fellowship Hall, placed on table with last name. Quilts to be completed, including hanging sleeve and paper label basted to lower right hand corner when looking at the back of the quilt. 91 members have entered quilts. Two additional workers are needed for Outtake Day to help fold quilts and get them put on tables. A volunteer is also needed to take Velma's aisle clerk job; check with Velma for time. OK to put all hangings on rollers if needed but no rigid forms in quilts. Need drivers to transport quilts on set-up day. Need bundlers on Wednesday evening from 5-7. Sue Stephenson reported Vendor Booths are "packed to the gills." There are 263 quilts registered for the show, a new record. There is a new floor plan for the show. There will be four Quilts of Valor presented at the show and it is requested that members line the hallway as recipients are led to the presentation. There will be two quilts presented each day and three of the recipients are WWII Veterans. Thursday potluck will be serving approximately 120 people; food can be delivered in the morning to the kitchen. Participants will include guild members, Angell Job Corps, 4-H members, and vendors. If you have a spare bedroom, please let Sue know since we have several out of town members. Need volunteer to pick up 4 quilt stands being borrowed from Latimer Center in Tillamook. With the addition of the Aquatic Center the restroom across from the quilt show is also the dressing room, which means it can have wet floors so people are encouraged to use the restrooms across from the break room. Advance sale tickets for show are available today. Outdoor sign committee needs help setting out signs on Thursday afternoon and picking up signs Saturday afternoon. The project will take 1-2 hours to put signs out and 30 minutes for pick-up. Last Quilt Show meeting is on July 20th at 1:15 pm at the Carriage House. Last chance to turn in Raffle Quilt tickets. Small Quilts charity donation drawn by Linda Reeve for "Rain, Rain Go Away;" her charity choice is Samaritan House. Boutique items need to be delivered 9-3 on Thursday.

2018 Raffle Quilt – reported that blocks are done but it won't be finished by the 2017 Quilt Show.

2018 Retreat – Rose Shaw reported that the August meeting is the last time to sign up. \$50 down payment; currently have a waiting list.

Membership – Gayle Vaughn reported 81 members, 3 guests and 2 new members present.

Paulette Stenberg – Red/White/Blue "388" quilt, used 388 triangles. Pastel Star quilt.

Janice Hoffman – May 2005 workshop wall hanging, purple and blue.

Joan Johnson – Orange/Black quilt. Two shirts. Cross-stitched "Lady in the Lake."

Jean Amundson – Bear Tracks in browns and greens started 2001-2003, finished after mini-retreat.

Linda MacKown – 2012 Workshop, Hawaiian wall hanging in purple, orange, yellow.

Sonny Hamner – "Cuddle Quilt," a large blue quilt, which took 3 years, 3 months, 3 weeks, 3 days to complete.

Judi Ruder – Halloween Project made from a block swap using lime green/purple.

Workshops – Gloria Zirges, Sweatshirt Jacket Class, September 9th. Judy Johnson workshop to be held Friday after the October meeting. Judy Niemeyer Mini-Retreat, November 2, 3, and 4.

Voting on 2017 Challenge Quilts took place during the break; winners will be announced at the Quilt Show.

MINUTES OF THE JULY 20, 2017 OCQG EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 10 am at the Carriage House in Newport, Oregon, by President Phoebe Hein.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES Sue Stephenson moved that the minutes of the June Executive Board Meeting be approved as published. Motion was seconded and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT The report was distributed. Treasurer Gail Chipman reported that she had moved \$2000 from the Reserve to Merchandise. Following much discussion it was decided that any change to a budget item needs to go thru the current budget chair. Current chair Janet Sylvester and Treasurer Gail Chipman will work out budget change and bring it back to the August Executive Board Meeting for approval.

OLD BUSINESS Georgia Sabourin reported the Memory Quilt needs binding and sleeve and then it is ready for the Quilt Show. There has been discussion regarding having "all" deceased members names on the quilt or in a binder by year with a photo. Further discussion will take place later.

NEW BUSINESS Phoebe Hein brought up a need to clarify By Laws – Dues Article III: Membership Section 5 on Page 52 of the OCQG Directory. Nan Scott proposed the following rewording "Annual membership dues for NEW members joining in August or later shall be reduced to half price for the remainder of the year. Those who RENEW memberships that have lapsed are not eligible for the discount." Jane Szabo moved to approve the rewording, Sue Stephenson seconded and the motion was approved by the Executive Committee.

Phoebe Hein brought up a need to clarify Policies, Page 58, Finance #4 & #5, Budgeted and Outreach Donations. #4 Budgeted Items do not have to go to Membership for vote. #5 Outreach Funds, need to be voted on by Membership. Discussion regarding May as month to take to General Membership for a vote. Nan pointed out that the word "may" would make the excess available to be added to the budget for additional items such as: OCQG quilt stands for use in show; bringing well known speakers, etc.

Executive board will address at September executive meeting and determine remaining profit amount before taking to the General Meeting. Currently working on 2016 profits, Phoebe asked Gail to email her with the calculations of excess dollars to spend and she will forward to the board members. Definition of Outreach: excess money, mention in newsletter so Guild Members can propose recipients. Organization receiving funds must be in direct line with Quilt Guild Mission. Currently donations to: Newport Historical Society, Latimer Center in Tillamook, North Lincoln County Museum. Executive Committee will make recommendations at August Executive Board Meeting then taken to September General Meeting for approval.

Miscellaneous Items - Quilt Navigator Invoice presented, already paid by Treasurer Gail Chipman.

Phoebe presented a donation request from Samaritan Foundation, which was not approved since they do not meet the requirements to receive money from the Guild. Twylla Hoch reported that the Quilt Guild will give demonstrations at the Oregon State Fair on Tuesday, August 29th from 10am-3pm. Sign-up sheet being circulated, recommends carpool. We receive free admission and parking. Board recommended taking bookmarks for Quilt Show as handouts. Sue Stephenson purchased two hand carts to move quilts, approximately \$40 a piece. The carts will be available for use by the Guild as needed. Nan Scott spoke in favor of the purchase and noted that the funds should be taken from capital expenses. Jean Amundson agreed since the carts will be used by the Guild for many years. Jane Szabo moved to reimburse Sue for purchase of the carts. Motion was seconded and approved by vote.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Advertising – Velma Freudenthal, no report.

Audit – Sheila/Nancy Cross, no report.

BOM – Jane Szabo, has 1 fruit/veggie square still available, next month will be Cake Mix square.

Budget – Janet Sylvester, budget items need to be in at least one week before September board meeting. Will remove outreach from Committee Expenses.

Challenge Quilts – Betty Jones, 25 people had signed up to do a quilt, 9 entries at July General Meeting.

Voting took place at meeting and awards will be given at Quilt Show. All participants will receive an award. The quilts will be returned to the makers after the August meeting so that they can provide a "story" about their quilt, which will be put in the newsletter. Discussion was held regarding importance of winners list being recorded for future reference. General reminder that committee chairs need to update committee notes.

Community Service – Norma/Phyllis, no report.

Documentation - Evelyn DePaolo/Twylla Hoch, next documentation dates are September 16 and October 21.

Finishing School – Paulette Stenberg, meeting July 27th to finish items for Quilt Show.

Hospitality – Pat Laub, no report.

Library – Joan Johnson, no report.

Membership – Nan Scott, reported 211 members.

Merchandising – Becky Mershon reported that the cup order almost sold out. Panels will be delivered next Wednesday, July 26. Cutting and stuffing of panels will take place on July 28th at 10am at the Bayshore Beach Club.

Newsletter – Judy McCoy, drop dead deadline for October newsletter is September 17th.

Programs/Workshops – Jennifer Reinhart, no reports.

Publicity – Jean Amundson has two more general articles for Oregon Coast Today and News Times before the Quilt Show. The signage for the quilt show as you enter town is beautiful.

Quilter's Surprise/Nifty Notions – Sue Stephenson, no report.

Quilt Show – Sue Stephenson, last meeting before Quilt Show is this afternoon. We will have use of the passageway between the two gyms again this year. Guild needs to look at mission, perhaps expand show which would make more money, more money for charitable donations. Time to start the conversation and form committee to look at future goals for money raised, attendance and notoriety.

2017 Raffle Quilt – Janet Sylvester, \$2422 to date, with ticket sales being slow.

Bed Turning – Sue Stephenson reported that there will be no Bed Turning by the Latimer Center this year. Twylla Hoch is arranging the Bed Turning and will have 10-12 quilts with members of the Guild helping. It was noted that the Latimer Center is running short on volunteers and has backed out of other Quilt Shows as well.

2018 Raffle Quilt – will not be ready for 2017 show.

Vet Quilt Project – Ginger Dale, there will be 4 quilts awarded at the Quilt Show. The Guild has also delivered a couple more quilts and a reminder that new names can always be added to the list. Sue Stephenson recommended information be put in the newsletter on each recipient.

Rec Center Hangings – Phoebe will contact Patsy, regarding red/white/blue small quilts to hang in front entrance.

Judy Niemeyer Mini-Retreat – Jennifer Reinhart, retreat is full, waiting list.

OTHER ITEMS

Reminder – Make sure the church is locked at end of meeting. It is the responsibility of the Program Committee.

Raffle Quilt – Suggested that decision on the next year's quilt be moved to earlier in year and completion of quilt so that it can be displayed at current Quilt Show. Recommend October for idea, theme, designs. Possible way to display at Quilt Show is to award the winning ticket on the current year's quilt and then unveil the new quilt for the following Quilt Show with tickets available to sell. Also, important to have Quilt ready for Portland Expo to expand ticket sales. Jennifer Reinhart recommended voting on next raffle quilt at the July General Meeting. Jan Hoffman pointed out it would give more months to sell tickets. Velma Freudenthal agrees that July is a great time. Jean Amundson questioned how realistic it would be since most members would not be able to work on the quilt until August. EXPO is a good way to sell more tickets.

Question on documentation: Is it only for Lincoln County residents? Answers: primarily for Lincoln County but exceptions can be made.

Retreat is filled up, with 6 people on the waiting list.

5 unclaimed mugs available, for \$12 each.

Sue Stephenson has the "single" copy of the 2017 Quilt Show for people to look at.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:28 am.


