

OREGON COASTAL QUILTERS GENERAL MEETING MAY 10, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6pm by President, Phoebe Hein.

MINUTES

Chris Benedetti moved for acceptance of the April General Membership minutes. Motion was seconded by Patti Stephens. Membership in attendance voted to accept the minutes.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Phoebe has received a thank you note from Sherry Flynn regarding the donation of quilts for the Hospice Quilt Auction. She will post the note to the blog.

A note from Patty Olson was read thanking the guild for purchasing raffle tickets last month from the Tacoma Quilt Guild.

It was reported that Phyllis Mitchell is doing well.

QUILT SHOW COMMITTEE PROPOSAL

Following the Quilt Show committee meeting on April 19, 2018 the committee presented to President, Phoebe Hein a proposal, described below for the purchase of street banners promoting the Quilt Show. President, Phoebe Hein called a special email OCQG Board Meeting on Friday, April 20, 2018. The Executive Board unanimously accepted the proposal by email vote. The committee proposal now needs to be brought to the General Guild Membership as the cost exceeds \$300. (See Standing Rules, Pg 52, Financial (A)).

Quilt Show proposal:

Purchase 20 street banners in 2018, made from marine acrylic, blue and white, with a quilt block image and the words "Quilt Show, First Fri and Sat, August". The cost is approximately \$1500. Various potential sources were investigated. DiJulio Displays has the best proposal.

The Executive Board approved spending \$800 already budgeted for capital improvements.

The Quilt Show Committee requests that the additional expenditure for the remaining \$700 be supplemented by banner sponsorships from individual guild members. The general membership must approve this supplement as it exceeds \$300. If approved, the Quilt Show Committee will provide instructions for those wishing to be sponsors.

The banners will be hung on light posts in the Newport central area by the city, and will be used in forthcoming years. Time is of the essence in order to have them ready for this year's show. The city will hang the banners free of charge.

A motion was made by Jane Szabo to accept the Quilt Show Committee Proposal. Motion was seconded by Debbie Mosley and passed by a hand vote of 74 members in favor.

Discussion followed regarding the banners wording, each banner will be double sided and will cost approximately \$50 each. Janet Webster will work with the printer regarding the wording. Sponsorship sign-up for the banners will be available at the next meeting.

Christmas Placemats – Shirley Gilmore showed the Christmas placemats that have been received and reminded the guild that placemat no larger than 12 x 16 and they are needed to be turned in by the July meeting. Placemats will hang at the Quilt Show in the cafeteria. Be sure to put your name on the back. Placemats will be returned at the September Guild meeting. It is ok to do the back as a spring placemat.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Documentation – Twy Hoch announced that the next documentation will be in Lincoln City on May 19th from 9:30 a.m. - 3 p.m at the North Lincoln Museum. The committee could use more help, please let Toni or Twy know if you are able to help. Workers will meet at the Newport Court House parking lot at 8:45 to carpool.

Finishing School – Phoebe reminded the group that the next Finishing School will be on May 24th from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. at the Carriage House. Come join the fun!

Challenge Quilts – Becky Mershon, still time to sign-up, make an elements quilt of earth, air, fire and water. You do not have to include all elements. Quilt cannot be larger than 30” square. Bring your finished quilt in a paper bag to the June membership meeting. All participants will be given an “Elemental Flower”.

Quilt Show – Jackie Stankey showed a Color Study quilt she is working on as an example of a modern quilt. You can pick up the Quilt Show reminders list on the back table. July 5th is the last day to register your quilt for the show. Members working at the show can shop from 8 a.m. - 9 a.m. on the day of the show.

Teecia Cornelius presented information on Sponsored Ribbons for the Quilt Show. She encouraged sponsors to use “creative names” for the ribbons. The ribbons can be picked up the day of set-up.

Community Quilters – Sue Stephenson reported that the committee had their first meeting at the new location in Waldport. Several beautiful, colorful community quilts were received during the meeting. The committee will meet on the first Thursday of the month from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. There will be work stations at the meetings - #1 – patterns pick; #2 – fabric bins; #3 – cutting area to make kits. Quilt Kits are available at the regular guild meetings. Bags were made for kids when they come to the “hope chest”, all shapes and sizes. The committee received a very generous donation of cotton fabric. The committee is sponsoring an “Ugly Fabric Quilt” contest. Quilts will be on display at the show and voted on for “Prettiest Ugly Fabric Quilt”, there will be a prize for the winner. Bring your quilt to the July meeting.

2019 Raffle Quilt – Jane Szabo, has handed out some packets and is still taking names of quilters that would like to help.

2019 Guild Retreat – Phoebe reported that sign-up will start at the June membership meeting. Policy for refunds needs to be finished and accepted before sign-up is started.

Rec Center Quilts – Debbie Mosley, reported that “Summer Quilts” will be going up on Saturday. A reminder for quilts will be put on the BLOG. Next theme for quilts is “Red/White/Blue Patriotic” and quilts will hang from July – September.

Membership – Ruth Johnson, handed out directory updates today at the sign-in table. There are 82 members present and 3 guests.

Programs/Workshops – Jennifer Reinhart reported that the guild will take a break from workshops in 2019. FFO sign-ups – July Program sign up at workshop table. There will be a “Spring Potluck” at the May 2019 meeting. There are still openings for tomorrow's workshop.

Jennifer introduced Jaimie Davis from Portland, Oregon. Jaimie is a woman that “loves to make quilts” and will be putting on the Baltimore Workshop tomorrow.

Jaimie has taught and lectured for the American Quilters Society, the Northwest Quilting Expo and Quilt Connect USA. Her work has been shown in national and international exhibits including the International Quilt Show in Houston, Texas, the Pacific International Quilt Festival in Santa Clara, California and the International Art Competition for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Jaimie is a story-teller who enjoys spending time with people who love to sew. She has been teaching for over 20 years and believes that everyone who enters her classroom should feel happier and more confident when they leave. Color and curvy lines inspire her, and the joy of creating keeps her working late into the night.

Jaimie gave a very informative program on the history of the Baltimore Quilt and had a great saying that “anything on paper can be done in a quilt”. For more information or to purchase her patterns check LoopyTulips.com.
