

Minutes of the General Meeting, via Zoom

December 10, 2020

The meeting, via Zoom was called to order by Vice-President, Meralee Wilson at 1:06 P.M.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

No one stepped forward to request help following the wildfire disaster, so Nancy Cross will receive all the funds that were donated by Guild members. The check will be cut in the next week or two.

Treasurer Janet Sylvester was involved in a terrible auto accident and is recovering in Eugene for the next couple of months. Until she is ready to resume the Treasurer's duties, Nan Scott has volunteered to step in as co-Treasurer and will need to be added to the bank account signature card.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of last month's meeting were approved as published on the Guild's Blog.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Rose Shaw reported that the Veterans Quilts Project has delivered another 23 Veteran quilts and there are still 58 more on the waiting list. The committee would appreciate help making blocks, center medallions, entire tops, finished quilts and quilting services. There is a medallion pattern for these quilts being designed and will be available at the next open house event in Waldport on January 7 from 2:00-4:00.

Sue Stephenson reported for Community Quilts. Although she did not have the numbers of items distributed, she did know that Gabriel's Project (one recipient of our donated quilts) is no longer active nor receiving donations. She also said the Committee's inventory of items is good except for face masks. Requests for them are coming in again.

Becky Mershon said the Merchandise Committee is looking for a different company to print the Bridge Logo panels. It takes special fabric which the company we've been using is unable to obtain. She will provide an update when she gets more information. The Merchandise Committee will be at the next open house in Waldport on January 7.

Maria Hunter reported that only 88 or 89 membership renewals have been received to date. She advised all members to speak to their friends about getting their renewals in ASAP, as the handbook update is already in the works for 2021. Debbie Mosley volunteered to make
